He proposed the Takagi-Sugeno model, which is one of the most popular methodologies for developing fuzzy systems, in his dissertation 1985. He received the Doctor of Engineering degree from the Tokyo Institute of Technology in 1983. From 1987 to 1997 he worked in the central research laboratory and corporate multimedia promotion division at Panasonic (Matsushita Electric Industrial Co., LTD.) He was also a deputy director at the Laboratory for International Fuzzy Engineering Research (LIFE,) which was a national project supported by the Ministry of International Trade and Industry, from 1991 to 1993. He played a central role in establishing the focus of research when he was involved in launching and running the LIFE project. From 2005 to 2007 he was a Program Officer of the Japan Society for the Promotion of Science. Since 1998 he has been affiliated with the Department of Computer Science of Meiji University. Currently, he is using his experience of multi-media business development to refine the application and theoretical aspects of using fuzzy set theory in web intelligence.
